# MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS TRAINING

(MHAT GRANT)



#### WHAT IS MHAT?

Mental Health Awareness Training is a federal grant to conduct Crittenton Center's Trauma MHAT for Youth Project. The purpose of this project is to enhance partnerships and train individuals from child-family serving systems in western lowa to recognize signs and symptoms of possible mental health crisis, how to safely de-escalate crisis situations involving children and adolescents, and to provide education on resources available in the community for youth facing possible mental health crisis.

## WHY YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

**Youth Mental Health First Aid** teaches individuals how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among children and adolescents ages 12-18.

**QPR-** (Question, Persuade, and Refer)- is an additional training offered to teach individuals how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer an individual for help.

#### OUR GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

## 1. Implementation and Sustainability

To create the organizational capacity to successfully implement and sustain the grant's activities and intentions by reinforcing community partnerships.

### 2. Expand Access

To offer expanded access to two evidence-based mental health awareness training programs targeting youth mental health by promoting and offering these trainings with community youth-serving agencies, including law enforcement, education, child welfare, juvenile justice and health care.

#### 3. Collaboration

To improve collaboration and linkages among community agencies to promote understanding, create sensitivity, and enhance referral processes for accessing mental health services and resources for youth at-risk of or experiencing mental health disorders.
