

Street Outreach Program (SOP)

What is SOP?

The Street Outreach Program (SOP) aims to assist young individuals in transitioning from homelessness to safe and stable housing. This initiative focuses on creating meaningful relationships between Street Outreach Workers and runaway youth, as well as those experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Through this program, Crittenton Center strives to secure stable housing for youth, reconnect them with supportive adults, and provide access to essential community resources and services.

Target Population

Runaway, homeless, street youth and young adults currently located in the Siouxland Community up to the age of 26. These individuals served have been subjected to, or are at risk of, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, sex and/or labor trafficking, substance use and other coinciding mental & behavioral health disorders.

SOP Services

- Street-based education and outreach
